Community Development – The Planning and Zone Meeting scheduled for 4/15/2024 has been CANCELLED

Public Works – Expect overnight lane restrictions on St. Route 260. The Arizona Department of Transportation advises area drivers to plan for overnight lane restrictions on State Route 260 in Cottonwood from Sunday evening, April 14, through Saturday morning, April 20 from approximately 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. The restrictions are needed so crews can safely begin the first phase of pavement repairs along this section of SR 260 by removing the top pavement surface. Additional overnight and daytime work will take place in May when the final pavement surface is placed.

Tourism & Economic Development – This weekend, Cottonwood is thrilled to play host to 32 ASU Tourism students and faculty for an enriching exploration of our vibrant tourism and commerce scene.
